

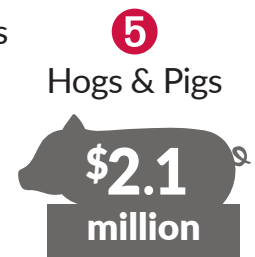
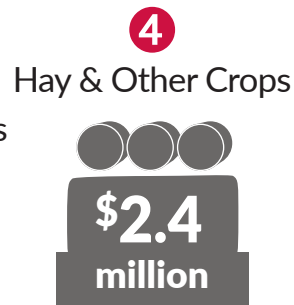
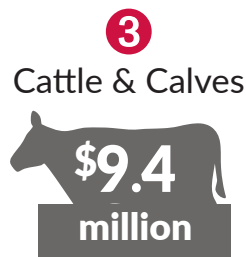
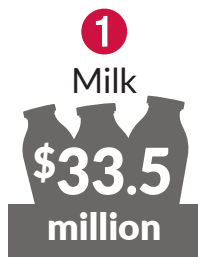


AGRICULTURE WORKS HARD FOR ▶ LA CROSSE COUNTY

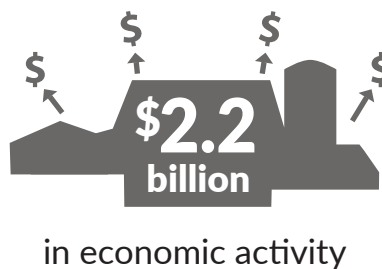

HOW MANY PEOPLE DOES AGRICULTURE EMPLOY?



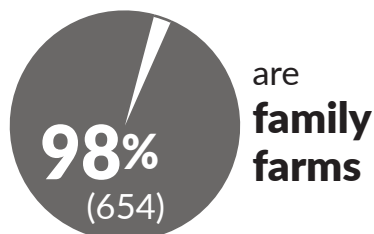

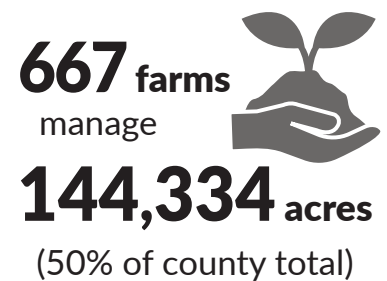

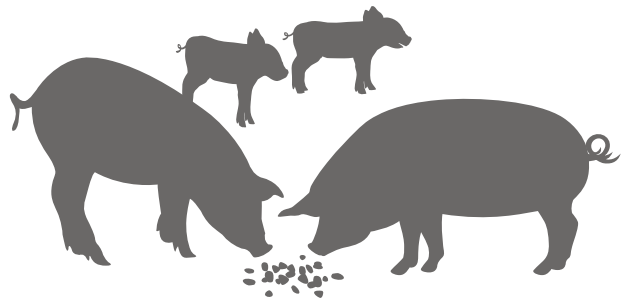


THE AGRICULTURE SECTOR BENEFITS THE ENTIRE COUNTY
