

THE AGRICULTURE SECTOR BENEFITS THE ENTIRE COUNTY

Monroe County agriculture is diverse. Cranberry marshes cover the low-lying sandy soils in the northeast. Dairy and beef operations dot the silt and clay loam soils in the ridges and valleys of the county's central and southern areas. And cash grain and diversified farms can be found throughout. Dairy, cash grain, cranberries, and beef, are the counties top revenue producers. Monroe County ranks second in the state in cranberry production and in the top 20 in dairy, beef and forage production. It is also home to many fresh-market produce growers as well as a number of organic farms.
