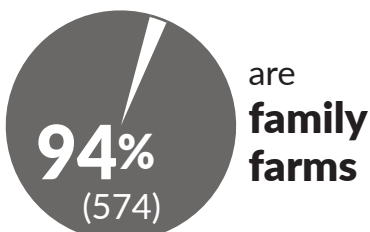

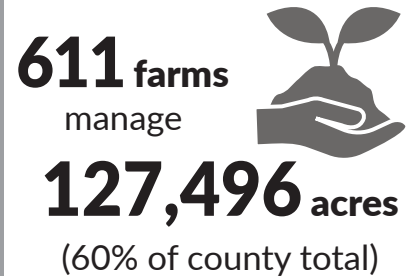

THE AGRICULTURE SECTOR BENEFITS THE ENTIRE COUNTY

Racine County is home to a wide variety of agricultural operations. While the area devoted to agriculture is small relative to other counties in the state, Racine County ranks amongst the top ten in terms of vegetable sales. The county’s green industry is also a leader, especially in sod production. Corn and soybean production reigns in terms of total sales and acreage. Though development continues to change the landscape, the proximity of a large population has provided opportunities for Racine County farmers to sell their products directly to consumers through several area farmers markets, roadside stands, and on-farm stores.
