

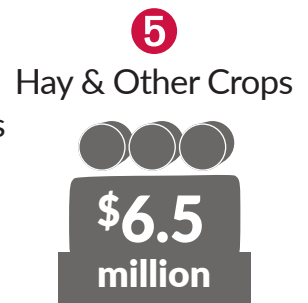
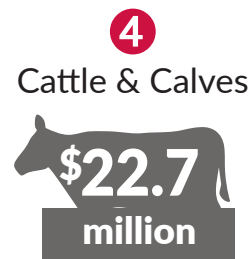
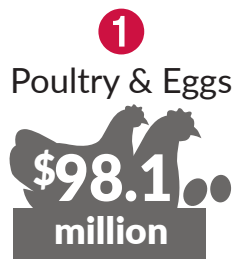


AGRICULTURE WORKS HARD FOR ▶ TREMPEALEAU COUNTY

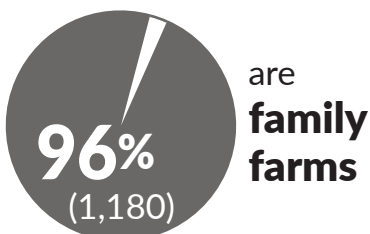

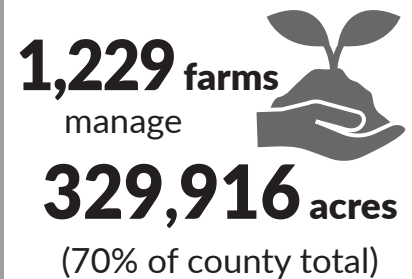

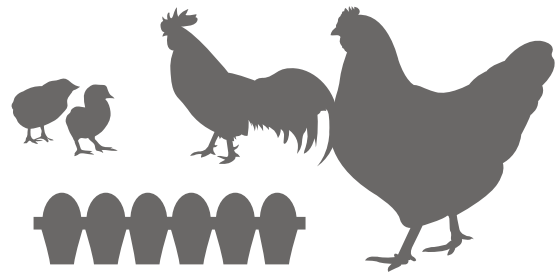


THE AGRICULTURE SECTOR BENEFITS THE ENTIRE COUNTY

Trempealeau County’s diverse agriculture includes dairy, beef, poultry and grain production. Poultry and egg production is the largest contributor of gross dollars with milk sales in a very close second place in the livestock sector. Sales of cattle and calves, horses and ponies, hogs, and sheep and goats all add to the diversity. Sales of grains and oilseeds are large contributors to Trempealeau County’s agriculture sector although grains and oilseeds are less than half of livestock sales. Vegetables and potatoes are produced on farms as well as traditional crops. Family-owned farms dominate the county landscape.
