

Nationally: 2019-\$919.7 billion economic impact!

Economic activity in the sector had been expanding in 2019:

- Production of arts and cultural goods and services in the U.S. added
 4.3 percent directly to the nation's GDP, for a total approaching a trillion dollars (\$919.7 billion).
 - This amount remains greater than the value added by such industries as construction, transportation and warehousing, mining, and agriculture.
- Arts and cultural industries had 5.2 million workers on payroll with total compensation of \$447 billion (not including self-employed creative workers

Wisconsin: 2019-\$10.9 billion economic impact!




Nationally: 2020-\$877 billion economic impact

First decline in arts and culture production since the Great Recession

Even so, the economic impact of the creative sector is significant: 4.2% of the nation's GDP and 4.6 million wage + salary workers.


Our work is rooted in the belief that arts and culture have the power to transform Milwaukee and be the catalyst for socialeconomic, and civic vitality.
