




All-Transactions House Price Index for the U.S.







CPI: Rent of Primary Residence





All Households: Households with burden greater than 30% of income




Owner Occupied: Households with burden greater than 30% of income







Renter & Owner Comparison: Households with burden greater than 30% of income







HUD Area Median Family Income & Home Ownership Status




Incomplete kitchen facilities

Year Structure Built – Percent of Housing Units (2018-2022 5-Year Estimates)








Statewide Cost, Vacancy Rates & Building Activity




Wisconsin Median Gross Rent by County






Wisconsin Median Home Value by County






Statewide Active Listings July 2016 – January 2024






Home Sales by Region






Statewide Vacancy Rates 2020 - 2022








Wisconsin – Minnesota Single Family Building
