

# What is SBIR/STTR? A \$

# A \$4.3 Billion Seed Fund!

The SBIR Program funds **technological breakthroughs**, life changing/improving technologies.

Federal funding programs (11 agencies participate) intended to help small businesses conduct R&D for development of new products or testing if existing products can be configured for a new setting.

What does that mean? The program wants small businesses to get their high tech, high risk products TESTED and OUT in the world.

#### SBIR Funded Techs:

- Lasik eye surgery
- Omega 3 supplement
- Infrared cameras for bridge repairs
- Safer battery technology
- Absorbable wound dressings
- AI/ML technology or new applications
- New engine tech allowing diesel engines to run on any fuel




# **CTC Success Story**

#### Wisclift - Crandon, WI



Innovation: Building on his military experience and seeing the lack of internet access In rural Wisconsin, Scott Williams decided to change that with a continuously flown drone that can provide communications. Once introduced to a Department of Defense Air Force SBIR program (AFWERX) it became clear they were a great fit, earning \$50,000 in funding.

#### Intrnls - Wales, WI



Innovation: An advanced manufacturing business creating filtering products to make carbon capture more efficient and cost-effective. Efficient filtering of Carbon Dioxide from power generation or other industrial processes is incredibly important to reducing electricity and fuel consumption. Company has NSF SBIR funding and is pursuing Department of Defense SBIR awards in 2024.
