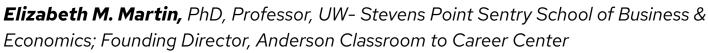

### What is an Entrepreneurial **Ecosystem?**

"An ecosystem is a community of living organisms (biotic factors) and their nonliving environment (abiotic factors) interacting as a unit. It encompasses all the physical and chemical conditions in an area, along with the plants, animals, and other organisms that inhabit it."

"In essence, an Ecosystem is a self-regulating system where living things and their environment interact to create a balanced and functional unit."

### What is an Entrepreneurial Ecosystem

A complex network of individuals, institutions, and policies that collectively support and promote the creation and growth of new businesses in a specific geographic region.

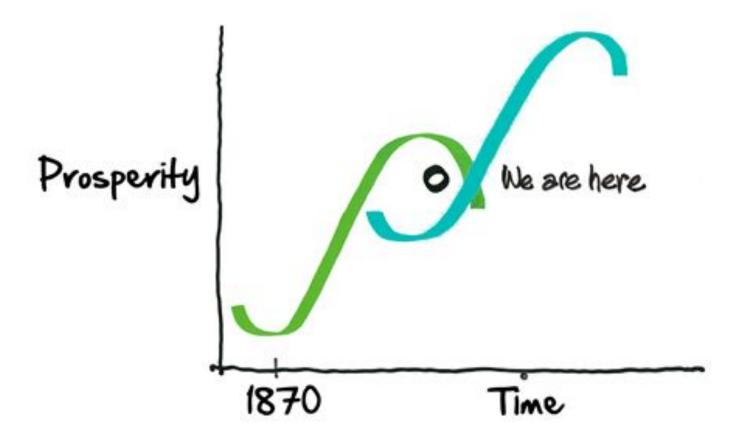
### **Strategic Planning**

- Designed for predictable environments
- Assumes hierarchy and centralized control
- Too slow and rigid for today's complexity
- Doesn't work well in open, loosely connected networks



### We need tools to enable us to

move into the future



- Fast-paced change
- Interconnected problems (e.g., talent retention, innovation, economic transition)
- Need for collaborative, adaptive responses
- Leadership is shared and distributed

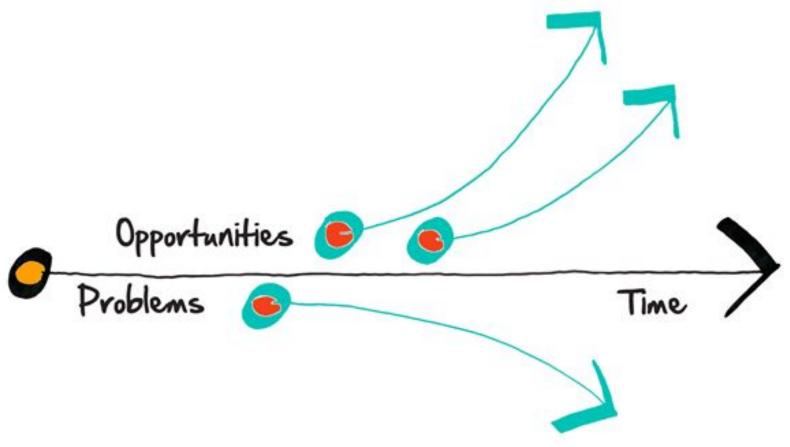
## Strategic **Doing**<sup>™</sup>

Strategic Doing enables people to form action-oriented collaborations quickly, move them toward measurable outcomes, and make adjustments along the way.

- A discipline for collaborative strategy in open networks
- Focuses on doing (not just planning)
- Light structure to guide thinking,
  conversation, and action
- Grounded in *practice*, not theory

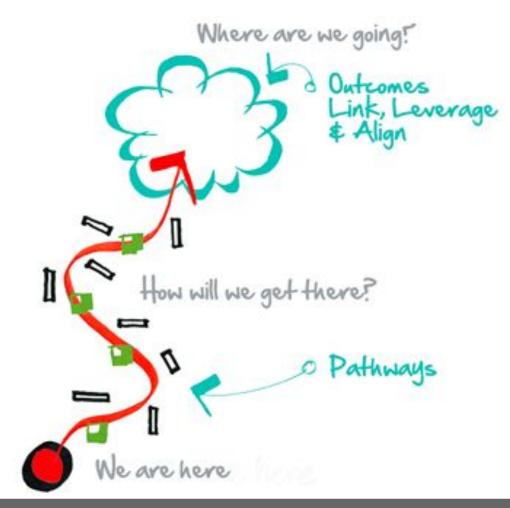


# We move in the direction of our conversations



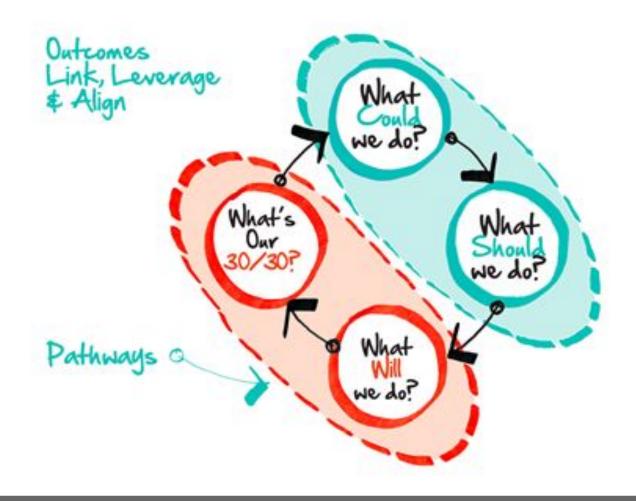


### Strategy answers two questions...

### Strategic Doing



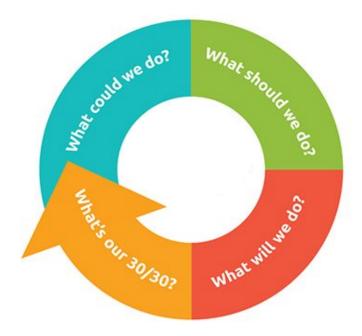

- Learn fast with 30/30 reviews



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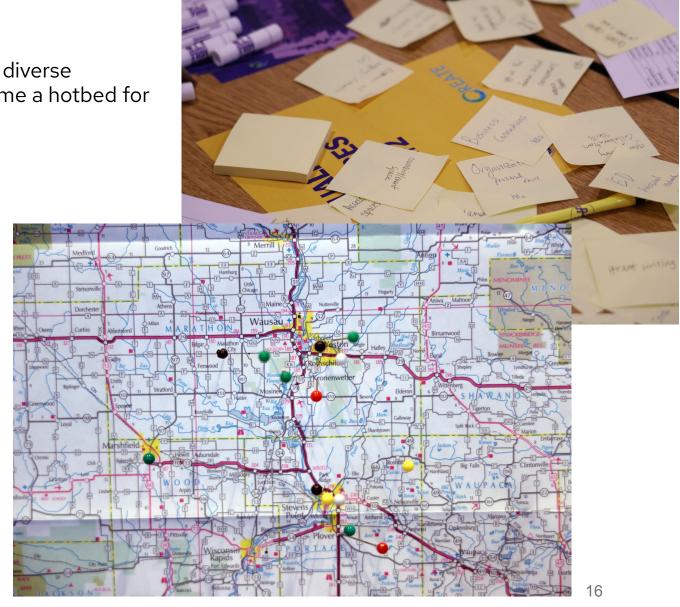
### History: How we got here

- Introduced to Strategic Doing by Liz Nilsen (Fall/22)
  - "a collaborative approach to strategy execution, especially useful in complex, rapidly changing environments where traditional top-down strategic planning is too slow or rigid"
  - Shoals Shift
- Formed core group
  - Placemaking and Entrepreneurial Ecosystem



First SD workshop (May/23)

- Partnership with the Agile Strategy Lab
- "Imagine we joined together as the many diverse communities in North Central WI to become a hotbed for collaborative innovation and creativity"
- Broad participation and support
  - Public and private participation
  - Sponsorship by Church Mutual
  - Large geographic region
- Outcomes
  - Emerging Entrepreneurs Night
  - Founders Network
    - 21 events
    - 425 participants
  - First Pitch
