Large-Scale Renewable Energy Siting in Wisconsin

In Wisconsin, renewable energy projects 100 megawatts or larger are approved by the Public Service Commission. Although local governments don't have jurisdiction over approving these projects, local communities still can influence the project. When communities work with RESET, they gain tools and resources to more effectively engage in the siting process.
